Introduction to EUFH

EUFH is a state-approved private university of applied sciences. After only three years of study the offered business degree programmes lead the students to an internationally recognised Bachelor-degree. The overall aim of EUFH is to prepare its students for a management career. As a small private university we are able to react particularly rapidly to the changing face of today's economy, so that students are always on top of the latest management trends.

Seminar groups at EUFH consist of about 30 students and even less than that in language classes and project work. Thus, EUFH encourages intensive studying in order to maximise the individual performance of each student.

EUFH also offers a number of extra-curricular activities as for example campus parties, collective sport and cultural activities and a close contact between students, lecturers and administration staff, which clearly contributes to the positive atmosphere at EUFH.

Location

You can easily live in Cologne or Bonn when studying at EUFH, because EUFH is located in Brühl/Rhineland, which is a small town about 15 km to the south west of Cologne and 20 km to the north of Bonn. It can be reached easily and quickly by train or tramway from the major junctions at Cologne and Bonn. EUFH is just a two-minute walk away from the station *Brühl Nord* (tramway No.18) and 5 minutes from Brühl train station.

Please note that students must have very good German language skills in order to qualify for studies under the regular Bachelor programmes at EUFH (at least Level B1 according to the Common European Framework of References for Language).

Living Expenses

On average, students in Germany live on € 800 per month. Accommodation costs represent the highest spending item with an average of 35 % of the budget. In Cologne, as a major built-up city area, students spend well above € 350 per month on average for their accommodation.

EUFH students can buy a semester ticket for public transport at reduced student rates. Further information will be provided during your first days at EUFH.



Health Insurance

Every student in Germany is requested to prove sufficient health cover before getting enrolled at a German study programme. You can decide on whether you would like to acquire a health insurance in your home country or whether you wish to get a German health insurance.

If you prefer to get the health insurance in your home country you will have to make sure that it covers all the costs that might occur during your stay and that it is valid for the complete study period.

In Germany you can obtain a student health insurance from the AOK or other health insurance companies at a reduced rate for students (approx. € 80 per month).

EU nationals need the European Health Insurance Card of their home health insurance as valid insurance proof, which has to be taken to the AOK in Cologne to be recognised accordingly. AOK will provide you with a German health insurance certificate or card.

Registration

As soon as you have found a room or an apartment, you are requested to proceed to the registration authorities within one week. The reporting at the registration authorities is a compulsory step for everyone who has a place of residence in Germany. To register, you must normally present your passport, if necessary with a visa, your rental agreement or confirmation from your landlord that you have moved into his/her accommodation or name/address of your landlord and possibly other documents such as the registration certificate from your university.

Important: The registration authorities will provide you with a confirmation of registration. Make sure you keep this in a safe place. Without proper registration you might be hold liable to face a penalty as registration is compulsory!

Banking

For non-European students we strongly recommend to open a blocked account, a special account with a blocking period, which means that you are only allowed to take out a certain amount of money each month. This account is very often needed for your visa and the Foreign National Registration Office in Germany. The amount is ca. € 670 which you have to multiply by the number of months of your stay (e.g. 6 months: $6 \times \text{€ } 670$). You can already open this block account beforehand, e.g. with *Deutsche Bank*. It is very important to contact the German embassy or consulate when opening a blocked account in your home country in order to receive detailed requirements about the exact amount or the application procedure.

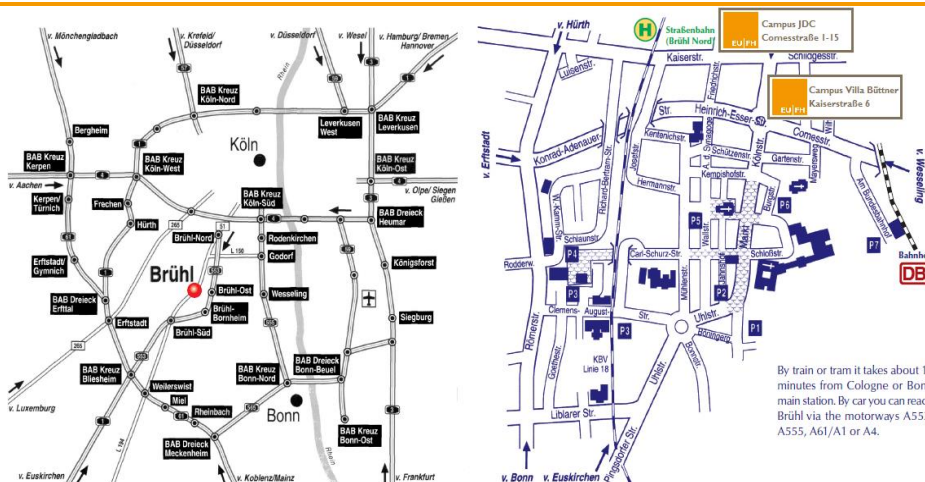
If you would like to open a bank account in Germany you will have to bring your ID-card/passport, visa, enrollment certificate and the registration certificate of the city of residence in Germany (e.g. Brühl, Cologne, Bonn).
