Introduction to EUFH

EUFH is a state-approved private university of applied sciences. After only three years of study the offered business degree programmes lead the students to an internationally recognised Bachelordegree. The overall aim of EUFH is to prepare its students for a career in the middle management. As a small private university we are able to react particularly rapidly to the changing face of today's economy, so that students are always on top of the latest management trends.

Seminar groups at EUFH consist of about 30 students and even less than that in language classes and project work. Thus, EUFH encourages intensive studying in order to maximise the individual performance of each student.

EUFH also offers a number of extra-curricular activities as for example campus parties, collective sport and cultural activities and a close contact between students, lecturers and administration staff, which clearly contributes to the positive atmosphere at EUFH.

## Location

You can easily live in Cologne or Bonn when studying at EUFH, because EUFH is located in Brühl/Rhineland, which is a small town about 15 km to the south west of Cologne and 20 km to the north of Bonn. It can be reached easily and quickly by train or tramway from the major junctions at Cologne and Bonn. EUFH is just a two-minute walk away from the station *Brühl Nord* (tramway No.18) and 5 minutes from Brühl train station.

## Living Expenses

On average, students in Germany live on  $\notin$  800 per month. Accommodation costs represent the highest spending item with an average of 35 % of the budget. In Cologne, as a major built-up city area, students spend well above  $\notin$  350 per month on average for their accommodation.

EUFH students can buy a semester ticket for public transport at reduced student rates. Further information will be provided during your first days at EUFH.



## Health Insurance

Every student in Germany needs to prove that he or she is sufficiently covered by a health insurance before he or she can get enrolled at a German University. You can either decide whether you wish to acquire a health insurance in your home country or whether you wish to get a German health insurance.

If you prefer to get the health insurance in your home country you will have to make sure that it covers of all the costs that might occur and is valid for the complete time of your stay.

In Germany you can obtain a student health insurance from the AOK or other health insurance companies at a reduced rate for students (approx. € 80 per month).

EU nationals need the European Health Insurance Card of their home health insurance, which has to be taken to the AOK in Cologne to be recognized. AOK will provide you with a German health insurance certificate or card.

#### Housing

EUFH cannot provide accommodation, but can help the students. It's the student's responsibility to find his or her accommodation.

#### Registration

As soon as you have found a room or an apartment, you are required to report to the registration authorities within one week. Reporting to the registration authorities is a compulsory procedure for everyone who has a place of residence in Germany. To register, you must normally present your passport, if necessary with a visa, your rental agreement or confirmation from your landlord that you have moved into his/her accommodation or name/address of your landlord and possibly other documents such as the registration certificate from your university.

Important: The registration authorities will provide you with confirmation of registration. Make sure you keep this in a safe place. Without registration you might be punished with a penalty as registration is compulsory!

## Banking

For non-European students we strongly recommend to open a blocked account, a special account with a blocking period, which means that you are only allowed to take out a certain amount of money every month. This account is very often needed for your visa and the Foreign National Registration Office in Germany. The amount is ca.  $\in$  638 which you have to multiply with the number of months you are staying (e.g. 6 months: 6 x  $\in$  638). You can already open this block account when you are in your home country, e.g. with *Deutsche Bank*. It is very important that you contact the German Embassy or consulate if you open a blocked account in your home country in order to receive detailed requirements about the exact amount or the application procedure.


If you would like to open a Bank Account in Germany you will have to bring your ID-Card/Passport, Visa, Enrollment Certificate and the Registration Certificate by the city you are living in in Germany (e.g. Brühl, Cologne, Bonn).
